## **Oral Health**

(Approved by Board 08/08; Reviewed and Re-approved 07/11)

The New Hampshire Public Health Association (NHPHA) recognizes that oral health is linked with overall health. Dental caries, an easily-transferable bacterial infection of tooth enamel, affects individuals throughout the lifespan.

Untreated dental disease can result in pain, infection, poor nutrition, tooth and tissue loss, absence from school or employment, and death. Despite state-wide efforts at increasing access to dental care, low income children and many elderly remain at high risk of untreated dental disease and its sequelae. NHPHA supports adequate access to preventive and therapeutic care for all.

The NHPHA recommends traditional and innovative initiatives to:

- Increase access to evidenced-based preventive care through regulatory change, workforce development, and provision of alternate screening and treatment settings;
- Provide education for caregivers, providers, policy-makers, and the public;
- Establish optimal fluoridation through community-water treatment, commercial products and provider intervention
- Make available appropriate and timely use of preventive and restorative interventions
